As reported also on the web site alohawaiiionipaa.org, its friends and board members supported and participated in programs that benefitted Native Hawaiians, the Environmental movement and homeless support as well as its new direction of supporting Waimanalo's Hui Mahi'ai Aina.

Because of the Covid-19 pandemic that largely shut down Hawaii between the middle of March and June, some of the proposed and ongoing projects were curtailed. Emphasis was therefore placed on "staying closer to home." This included focusing on producing face masks for free public distribution, providing the first crops of ulu as well as coconuts to people in need, and supporting Hui Mahi'ai Aina in its efforts to develop a largely self-supporting village and cultural center for Waimanalo's houseless.

Project Proposals for 2020-21 Fiscal Year

- a. Continue to support Hui Mahi'ai Aina in its efforts to develop a largely self-supporting village and cultural center for Waimanalo's houseless (After the 2016 election that largely disenfranchised minorities, alohaHawaiiionipaa.org explored new avenues to realize its dream of gathering support for a Hawaiian Cultural Center operated by Native Hawaiians that provides steady income and that can also serve the visitor industry).
- b. Emphasize Hawaiian boys and girls 4-year scholarships (\$2,000/yr. & support) for science-based B.S. degrees and help qualified students achieve these goals.
- c. Explore a steady income base for more scholarship support such as 2-year agricultural scholarships and Hawaiian Civic Club scholarships by initiating programs tailored to overseas visitor support.
- d. Continue to support the Kapele girls in performing year-round largely free of charge at different functions.
- e. Continue to grow Ti-leaves year round, providing them to the Mayor's Office of Culture and Art (MOCA) for Memorial Day as well as Native Hawaiian functions. Continue the free distribution of ulu (over 300/yr.), coconuts and other garden harvests to people in need.
- f. Continue to support environmental groups such as the Conservation Council of Hawaii.
- g. Establish closer cooperation with other Native American minority groups.
